Covid Plans

This remains a contentious issue for most people in how best we move forward and get back to 'normal'. Currently other than having hygiene expectations, the school is not expected to have anything else in place. However, as we move into the autumn, we'll await any updates and hope the school isn't as affected as it was during Terms 3 and 4 last year.

Attendance

There have been some 'very definite' communications from the Department for Education over the summer with regards to attendance. Expectations have now returned to how they were, with the last national average taken before the pandemic of just over 96% being used as a benchmark for schools. Please let's work together this year to ensure the attendance percentage for Priestley achieves at least the magic 96% mark.

Remember, as little as 7 days off during a whole school year for holiday, medical appointments or illness will already bring your child's attendance down to 96%.

You are required to contact school to inform us of a reason for absence and we are being required to ask for a little detail other than your child is 'just feeling poorly'. We will be following up all absences, so please do not take out any frustrations on the school staff, they are just doing what we are being told to do. Those parents of children whose attendance does start to drift will be expected to attend School Attendance Meetings to discuss the issue. Please work with us and stop this from needing to happen or worse still, having to involve the Education Welfare Officer. As usual the school's policy of not authorising holiday during term time will continue.

Change to the start of the day

I am sure by now we have got used to the 8.30 am start, registers remain open for 20 minutes, so should your child arrive after 8.50 am they will be marked as late and then without a valid reason with an unauthorised absence. Remember, these unauthorised absences mount up quite quickly and will result in a fine. Can we please ask that if your child is not in school for any reason, that you leave a message on the school answer machine before 8.30 am, thank you. This allows us to mark the registers correctly and cancel any dinners as required.

I apologise for the slight crush in the morning when the gates open. We have had to close the gates until we are ready to accept pupils onto site, due to the fact a growing number were either being dropped off or making their way to school early, often entering the school site before 8.00 am. Children were then leaving the school site and going out on to the Rec. As we are not able to take responsibility for the children before the start of the school day, the decision was taken to close the site until the school is ready. We are looking at trying to widen the path from the gates up on to the playground, so bear with us. Thank you.

We restarted Breakfast Club on Monday, 6 September. There is a limited number of places available, please contact the school office for more information.

Free School Meals

Can I please remind you that if you are entitled to apply for benefit based Free School Meals, that you do so as soon as possible, even if your child is in KS1 and also entitled to a UIFSM. Should the Government continue to fund Free School Meals during the school holidays, you would be eligible for these vouchers and I would hate for anyone to miss out in October.

Bikes & Scooters

Please can all those who ride or scoot to school, please ensure your child disembarks at the playground gates and walk their bike or scooter to the bike shed, that way we can ensure everyone stays safe on the playground.

Water Bottles

Please can I remind everyone that the children require their own named water bottle in school that should be only filled with water please, no squash or juice. Thank you
